# December 11, 2016 — Third Sunday of Advent

Today is Gaudete Sunday, which means "rejoice." For three weeks now we have been preparing for Christmas and, one hopes, enjoying some peace to pray and anticipate the coming of the Lord, not just as a baby two thousand years ago, but also in the end-times, the parousia, when the Lord will come again in glory. This is the Sunday when the rejoicing begins. Advent, unlike Lent, is not a penitential time, but a time of waiting and anticipation for the fulfillment of God's promises. "[We] will see the glory of the LORD, / the splendor of our God" (Isaiah 35:2). So, "Be patient, brothers and sisters, until the coming of the Lord . . . Make your hearts firm, because the coming of the Lord is at hand" (James 5:7, 8).

THE ONE WHO IS TO COME John the Baptist, wanting to confirm that Jesus is the Christ, sends his disciples to inquire about him. Jesus responds, echoing the words of the prophet Isaiah, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them" (Matthew 11:4-5). By this reply, Jesus knows that John will recognize that he is the Messiah, the one who is to come, and rejoice.

MORE THAN A PROPHET Jesus then turns to the crowds, and teaches them, and us, about John the Baptist. John must have been quite a sight, and quite a forceful preacher. He drew great crowds, including Pharisees and Sadducees, who came out to see and hear him, and many were baptized. John has spent years baptizing with a baptism of repentance in preparation for the One who is to come. Jesus in turn pays tribute to his kinsman, and at the same time reveals his own mission as the Anointed, the One who will come to bring salvation to all who believe. He praises John, and reveals that John is the prophet who has come to proclaim the coming of the Reign of God in Christ. Jesus says, "This is the one about whom it is written, / Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; / he will prepare your way before you" (Matthew 11:10). So, as James tells us in the second reading, we must not complain about one another so that we will not be judged in those final days. We can rejoice in the coming of the Reign of God. We must be patient. We celebrate Christmas not only as the secular holiday with Santa and the reindeer, the Christmas tree, the gifts, the parties, and all the glitz, but as the Incarnation and the joyful coming of the Lord our God.

#### December 11, 2016

#### **Dear Family:**

The prophet Isaiah is bursting with good news for the nations. As the spokesperson of God, Isaiah announces that a promise of renewal is taking place. First, the earth will be transformed; the parched land will bloom with new life. Even more amazing, those broken in their bodies will be transformed as well; the deaf will hear, the lame will leap, the blind will see and the mute will speak. The power of God brings rejoicing. The psalmist sings praise for the Lord who does what Isaiah had prophesied. The generous love of God knows no bounds; the most vulnerable, the widows and orphans, are raised up. Even the stranger is not over looked.

In our Second Reading, James instructs the early Christians on waiting - one of the themes of Advent. But are we patient in our waiting? Our holiday season can be filled with busyness and social excitement to such a degree that we all feel rushed and harried. To wait with patience is to take time to grasp more deeply the reason for our waiting, the coming of the Lord into our lives. Patient waiting prepares our hearts to be ready and our thoughts to be focused on the mystery of the one who will come to dwell in our midst.

The Gospel moves to the end of John the Baptist's life and to his inquiry about whether Jesus is the expected one, the one he foretold. Jesus' response is twofold. He frames his answer by describing what he has done, echoing the prophetic words of Isaiah in the First Reading. Then he asks the disciples a question and responds himself by describing the important role of John as prophet and messenger. As John's role comes to an end, the role of the one he announced is unfolding. John offers us a model of waiting, and also of being committed to our own ministry of announcing Jesus to a waiting world.

**Some questions for reflection:** 

How are Isaiah and John similar in their roles?

Are you a patient person with matters in your spiritual life?

How can you put the material and the spiritual in proper perspective during Advent?

Thanks so much to all who helped with our Christmas Open House. For all, it proved to be a work of love and pride in our church fellowship and our faith in Jesus Christ as we prepare to celebrate His birth. You are all very generous and talented. You are also very appreciated by me. It was good to visit with so many of you at our gathering and I continue to pray for us all to enjoy a great and Holy Christmas Season.

On Monday December 12th, many generous and gifted parishioners will gather to begin decorating our beautiful church helping all of us to prepare for Christmas. We welcome any who can assist. It is work, but also fun and fellowship - and of course----food! Let us be grateful for these gifted, generous folks who add so much to our celebrations in this Holy Season.

Wednesday will be a busy day as well. We welcome our Senior Citizens for a meal in our Church Hall, and special surprise entertainment awaits them. Also on Wednesday, the priests and deacons of our deanery will gather at the rectory for a meal and fellowship before we make haste into the great liturgical celebrations for Christmas.

Please join us as well on Thursday the 15th at 6:00 p.m. in the church for our St. John School Christmas Concert. This concert is free and open to all. A love offering may be given if you feel so inclined, but is not required. Come and enjoy! The sound of young voices calling us to the joy of Christmas is sure to offer solace for all struggling to find peace at this time.

Finally, I urge us all to hear and listen to the message of St. James calling us to wait with patience. (I write this to myself first and try to keep it as a focal point in my prayer as days become more busy). We must ask ourselves, are we giving of ourselves because we love and are grateful? Or, are we doing all we do for some other reason? I have recently heard some folks giving voice to things that are not really of God. We must be reminded that Jesus in the incarnation is a free gift to us - our salvation from God. So, the language of ultimatums (e.g. it has to be done this way, my way, on my schedule) may not really be a language expressing our faith in God's great gift given to us in Jesus Christ. St. James tasks us. Let us pray about that and work on it together.

Peace, Fr. Greg A few folks have asked for a copy of the five principles of forgiveness about which I recently preached. Here's a printing of them for your reflection:

# FIVE THINGS TO REMEMBER ABOUT FORGIVENESS:

- 1. THE FIRST PERSON WHO BENEFITS FROM ME FORGIVING SOMEONE ELSE IS ME? [WHY? BECAUSE IN FORGIVING ANOTHER I NO LONGER ALLOW THAT PERSON/EVENT TO HAVE POWER OVER ME.]
- 2. BEING A FORGIVER DOES NOT MAKE US FOOLS. [RIGHT IS RIGHT, WRONG IS WRONG. SOMETIMES, WHEN FOLKS HAVE A PATTERN OF HURTING US, WE STILL FORGIVE BUT KEEP A "HOLY DISTANCE." WE ARE STILL KIND/CIVIL.]
- 3. FORGIVING ANOTHER IS AN ACT OF OUR WILL. [WE WILL OFTEN HAVE TO REMEMBER THAT WE HAVE CHOSEN TO FORGIVE AND COMMIT OURSELVES TO THAT TRUTH WITHOUT HAVING THE "FEELING" OF HAVING FORGIVENESS. THE "FEELING" MAY TAKE A LONG TIME OR MAY NEVER COME, BUT I CAN ALWAYS COMMIT TO GOD AND TO MYSELF THAT I CHOOSE TO FORGIVE.]
- 4. WE DO NOT HAVE TO WAIT FOR THE PERSON/INSTITUTION/SYSTEM TO ASK FOR FORGIVENESS BEFORE WE OFFER FORGIVENESS.

  [FRANKLY, A PERSON OR INSTITUTION/SYSTEM MAY NEVER ASK FOR FORGIVENESS. THERE ARE SOME FOLKS WHO THINK THEY HAVE NEVER DONE ANYTHING WRONG TO US.]
- 5. FORGIVENESS FOR US IS A JOURNEY. [JUST LIKE OUR BAPTISM IS A JOURNEY IN FAITH AS WE CONTINUALLY DEEPEN OUR LOVE OF GOD, THE SACRAMENTS, THE SCRIPTURES AND OUR GOOD WORKS SO GOES OUR PATH IN FORGIVENESS. WE ARE HUMAN AND WE STRIVE TO FORGIVE COMPLETELY AS GOD HAS FORGIVEN US. HOWEVER, I LIKE TO SAY THAT "GOD HAS HOLY AMNESIA." SOMETIMES, IT TAKES A WHILE FOR US ON THE JOURNEY BEFORE WE CAN FORGIVE LIKE JESUS. NONETHELESS, HE IS THE PERFECT IMAGE OF FORGIVENESS AS HE SUFFERED ON THE CROSS AND CRIED OUT TO HIS FATHER, "FORGIVE THEM FOR THEY KNOW NOT WHAT THEY DO."]




