

Not My Problem

Paul was not bragging when he talked about the toil and drudgery he endured while proclaiming the gospel. He makes a point of his working so as not to burden anyone. He worked to support himself, rather than asking the new Christians to support him--just the opposite of what the scribes and Pharisees were doing, according to the gospel. Jesus accused them of laying heavy burdens on people, without helping them to bear those burdens. So what kind of burdens did the Pharisees impose?

The Pharisees and scribes were very familiar with the laws of their Jewish religion. Almost every detail of daily life was covered by some law. And they could be very persuasive about strictly keeping those laws. Originally those laws and regulations were meant to set the Hebrews apart from other peoples, to be a sign of holiness. For example, the Ten Commandments are based on loving God above all else (first three commandments) and loving your neighbor (last seven.) But over the years, rabbis added more and more details to the laws, until it was almost impossible to keep them all straight. But what if someone needed help on a Sabbath? If you broke a Sabbath rule, even for a good reason, you could not go to the Pharisees to get an exemption. They would say, "Not my problem." Remember the times Jesus cured the sick on the Sabbath, and how they condemned him for working on the day of rest.



Jesus, however, came to remind us that holiness is more important than scrupulosity. If we truly live the ideal of loving God with our whole being and loving our neighbor, we will find that love is much easier to bear than the fear of doing something wrong. Jesus also gave us his Holy Spirit to help guide us in the path of holiness. And through his death on the cross, Jesus gave us forgiveness if we do commit a sin. All we have to do is confess the sin to experience that forgiveness. So keeping the law of love is no problem.

Dear Family:

Our scriptures this weekend help us to call attention to humility. We are all called to be wary of preferring our own glory to God's. We don't follow the Gospel to be esteemed. Pope Francis told the ministers of the church and all evangelizers to take on the "smell of the sheep" (The Joy of the Gospel, Evangelii Gaudium 24).

Living our faith with this kind of humility and simplicity, we can consider cultivating doing good and getting no credit; doing a small kindness for someone anonymously. For example, send a grocery gift card to someone who needs it, or discreetly donate vacation hours to a coworker. This isn't to say that we shouldn't engage people. We just need to make sure our relationships are based on solidarity, not a sense of superiority.

Read about solidarity, one of the themes of Catholic social teaching, at <http://www.usccb.org/beliefs-and-teaching/solidarity.cfm>. As an act of humility and candor, we could also pray with our journals and list some of the ways in which we fail to practice what we preach.

Many thanks to the Knights of Columbus, local law enforcement and all who assisted with this year's Acadian Festival. Thanks to all of you who endured the elements to come out and celebrate our heritage. Every now and then, even though we pray for good weather, we must face the elements of creation. A lot of planning and hard work goes into our Acadian Festival. We are grateful for everyone's gifts of time and talent in putting on such a great community event. Go Knights!

Enclosed in this bulletin is our projected budget for this fiscal year. With the support of our Parish Finance Committee we present this budget to keep you informed regarding the stewardship of financial support that each of you offer our parish. Since my first year as pastor we have published our financial status to be sure each of you knew that we carefully watch over your gifts to St. John the Evangelist Church.

We are always looking for opportunities to make more efficient use of your monetary gifts. Our staff continuously looks for opportunities to be frugal and still meet the needs of those we serve. This year we have saved over \$12,000 by beginning to use a cleaning service for the Church, office and rectory. We have the approval of the Finance Committee and are now looking for a portable building to take the place of the mini storage unit behind the church. The plan is to have a building that will suit a need for the storage of items in the mini unit thereby eliminating the monthly rental cost.

All this being said, the committee did ask me to make an appeal to you all for increased offertory giving. **There are some months (summertime) where it is difficult for us financially. I would ask you to take some time to speak as family about financial support of St. John the Evangelist Church. If each person could give \$2 or \$3 more, this would be a great help to continuing to meet the needs of the parish. Please talk and pray about this. We need your assistance. Some of us will not be able to increase offertory giving. This is understandable and we ask you and all of us to pray for generous hearts in giving back to God by supporting our St. John the Evangelist Church.**




