Pentecost Sunday — May 20, 2018 Caution: Spirit at Work

If Pentecost celebrates the gifts of the Spirit, it can tempt us to separate the Spirit from the Father and Jesus. Sometimes we think of the Father as the God of the Old Testament, Jesus as center of New Testament, and the Spirit as God of the present age, almost as if the Father and Jesus were enjoying their retirement. Actually, all three persons share one God-life. Instead of three gods debating the fate of the universe, we have one God who is over all and in all.

The Spirit has been active in all ages. The prophets were empowered by the Spirit to proclaim God's word to Israel. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit led Jesus into the desert at the beginning of his ministry. (Search the word "spirit" in the four gospels and it appears 75 times.) Jesus was filled with the Spirit as he preached and worked miracles. Then at Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Spirit.

So what about Pentecost? It is really about using our gifts and sharing the good news. The Spirit gives us the power, courage, and energy to do this. The Spirit's gifts are meant to be shared. The prophets could not help proclaim God's message. Jesus shared all he knew with his disciples. The disciples went out to the world to spread the news of Jesus' death and resurrection. So we, too, are given gifts to be shared.

The greatest gift we have been given is the news of our salvation. This feast reminds us to share that with others. We may do that by example, as when we worship together, forgive others, give to the poor or help someone in need. We can also share that news by teaching our children about God and his love for them, teaching them to pray, or sharing our faith with other adults. As we come to realize how much God has done for us and how close he is to us, we will want to share that with others. Obviously, we can't make everyone believe in Jesus. But how sad would it be if someone we know was looking for the truth and we neglected to offer it?

Candle Price Increase

Due to the increase in candle costs, the Altar Society made the difficult decision to increase the price of the candles from \$3 to \$4 each. The current \$3 candle is not sufficient to cover their cost.

In addition, the purpose and duty of the Altar Society is to care for the liturgical needs of the church such as purchasing the hosts and communion wine, providing the altar cloths and other linens used for services and cleaning the sanctuary on a weekly basis. The candle fund helps to cover these additional necessary needs and is the only source of income for the Altar Society besides annual dues. We appreciate your support of our church and please continue to light candles.

"All for Jesus" Ministries Fair Saturday, May 19 and Sunday, May 20, 2018

St. John the Evangelist has many opportunities to serve and evangelize through its ministries. Our volunteers are vital in sustaining these outreach activities to others in faith. The ministries are in the areas of Worship, Spiritual Life, Religious Education and Community Life.

<u>WORSHIP MINISTRIES</u> are those ministries that are involved in the liturgical celebrations where we hear God's Word, receive Holy Communion, pray, sing and form the faith community at St. John the Evangelist Church. For more information and becoming involved, please call the church office at 225.687.2402.

<u>Lectors/Proclaimers</u> proclaim the Word of God and may lead the assembly in prayer at liturgical celebrations. Training and ongoing formation is required for lectors/proclaimers. They read on a rotating schedule at weekend and weekday Masses.

<u>Lay Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist</u> are directly commissioned by the Pastor to assist in the distribution of Holy Communion at scheduled liturgies and communion services, to carry Holy Communion to the homebound, the hospitalized and incarcerated. Special training and qualifications apply. They also participate in ongoing formation and serve on a rotating schedule for weekend and weekday Masses.

<u>Altar Servers</u> are students in grades 3-12 or adults who assist the Celebrant at liturgical celebrations. Training is required. They serve on a rotating schedule for weekend masses and weekday Masses as well as at special liturgies as needed.

<u>Sacristans</u> set up for special liturgical celebrations, funerals and weddings by attending to supplies, sacred vessels, altar linens and candles. They also attend to the proper storage and inventory of liturgical supplies and equipment in the sacristy.

<u>Ushers</u> serve as ministers of hospitality at Masses in greeting people, assisting with seating, assisting disabled worshippers, receiving offerings, directing a smooth flow of the assembly for receiving Holy Communion and distributing the weekly church bulletin after Mass is concluded.

<u>Choir</u> is composed of adults who lead and enable congregational prayer through song at 9:00am Mass and special liturgical celebrations. Choir practice is usually scheduled for Wednesday at 6:45pm generally following the school year with special emphasis for liturgical seasons. Contact Medric Smith for more information.

<u>Liturgical Environment</u> prepares the church for the liturgical seasons or special liturgical celebrations through the use of flower arrangements, decorations, banners or other appointments. Please contact Sallye Troxclair or Evelyn Varnell. For the crèche that adorns our church during Advent to Epiphany, please contact Bruce and Mary Kay Capone.

<u>Prayer Candles</u> located in the side altar in the church are maintained by volunteers who remove those candles that have burned completely and replenish the supply of new candles. Please contact Darryl Boudreaux or David LoBue.

<u>Church Landscaping Committee</u> takes care of maintaining the flowerbeds around the church, parish hall, rectory and parking lots. The committee has divided up the various flowerbeds in order to maintain them. To volunteer contact Donna Carville.

<u>Facilities Maintenance Project Team</u> works with Gary Perrault, Maintenance Manager, on special projects to repair, maintain or improve the facilities of St. John including the church, parish hall/office building and surrounding land as needed. Please contact David LoBue to volunteer to help.




