O Little Town of Bethlehem

There is a Christmas song that says of Bethlehem: "Yet in thy dark streets shineth the everlasting Light." Though today it has many modern homes and buildings, you can still see that it is part of "the hill country. . .of Judah." (Lk 1:39) It is not too far from En Kerem, where John the Baptist was born, and apparently where today's Gospel takes place.


We see in the Gospel reading today how Elizabeth and her unborn child rejoiced at the news of Jesus' coming birth. The story implies that Mary went to see Elizabeth as soon as the angel told her about Jesus. I would think that talking about it made this miracle more real.

Jesus is the "everlasting Light" mentioned in the song. That light shines today, not just in Bethlehem, but everywhere that his followers bring it. When we console someone who is mourning, that light shines. When we

forgive someone who hurt us, the light is burning. When we teach a child how to pray, it shines even brighter.

Our dark streets need the everlasting Light today as much as they did 2000 years ago. Today we remember how Mary and Elizabeth shared their faith in God. They did so much like we do today. Jesus, who seems to be invisible today, is seen in the shared faith of those who bring him into the world by their words and actions.

Dear Family:

Merry Christmas! On behalf of Deacon Alfred Ricard, our Parish Staff, and our St. John School Staff, I extend to you warm wishes for a most Blessed Christmas and a treasured Christmas Season.

Today we celebrate in joy the incarnate Word of God. The First Reading provides a backdrop in three parts: (1) a voice that announces a messenger coming over the mountains, bringing the Good News of God's enthronement as king of Jerusalem; (2) the guards responsible for watching over the ruins of Jerusalem see God returning to Jerusalem with the people who had been exiled many years before; and (3) a song of thanksgiving, which celebrates the way God has redeemed Jerusalem's people. In truth, this reading is a reversal of the story of the Babylonian exile.

Today's Gospel reading is the prologue of our parish patron's (John's) Gospel, in which Jesus is portrayed as the Word that comes forth from God's mouth, revealing God to the world. This word was with God in the beginning, and creation came into being through him. Yet when he came into the world among his own, his own rejected him. We are truly blessed by the central part of this poem, in which God declares those who accept the Word and believe in him to be children of God by God's will alone. This Word came to dwell (actual translation, "pitched his tent") among us, and we who are believers have seen his glory as the Father's only Son.

In the same way, the Second Reading from the Letter to the Hebrews depicts the Son as the climax and fullness of God's revealing words to the world. Some of the descriptions such as "refulgence of [God's] glory" and "imprint of his being" are reminiscent of personified Wisdom in Wisdom 7:26. The phrase "accomplished purification from sins" refers to Jesus' Crucifixion.

Some questions to reflect upon:

- Compare the Second Reading and the Gospel. Find the similarities and differences in their descriptions of the Son. What surprises you about what you found?
- As you reflect on the First Reading, imagine yourself joining the procession into Jerusalem led by God the king. What are your impressions?
- How have you experienced the Word having "pitched his tent" among us?

Three weeks ago on the first Wednesday of Advent, young people from St. John School came to the Parish Hall and sang a brief Christmas program for our St. John Senior Citizens at their annual luncheon. Their cheery attitudes and beautiful voices blessed that event and truly set the tone for the rest of our Advent. I am truly blessed and grateful to be spending my 5th Christmas with my St. John Family. Your great faith in the Lord Jesus and generous discipleship in service to the Gospel is always especially visible at this time of year.

Many thanks to all who helped ready our church and community for the Feast of Christmas. Thanks to our women's retreat director, our Catechists, all liturgical ministers, the decorating Angels in the Rectory, the Hall and the Church, the Alhambra group, Catholic Daughters of America, Knights of Columbus, Altar Society, Our Brother's Keeper, Homebound ministers and ministers to our two local Nursing Homes, Hospitality ministers for coffee and donuts, Loaves and Fishes ministry, Scouts, Grief Support ministry, Giving Tree ministers, Prayer Blanket ministers, Bible study coordinators and Adult Formation team, Prison ministry team, Knights of Peter Claver Women's Auxiliary and all others who share their gifts to bring the light of Christ to our community. Please know that you are all appreciated. You all bless us with the joy of Christ being born into our world.

Please continue the celebration of Christmas all the way through the Feast of the Epiphany on Sunday, January 6th. I hope you have great opportunities to celebrate being family. I also hope to see you at the Epiphany Concert. We've had a year to prepare and are truly looking forward to sharing our love of music with you.

Next weekend we will celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. The Knights of Columbus and I are really focused on helping foster loving families following the model of the Holy Family of Joseph, Mary and Jesus. So, next weekend we will offer the opportunity to make holy our efforts to live as did Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We will all pray a prayer together composed by the Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus for this Feast. If you will be away or can't be here, we wanted you to have this prayer to pray with your families wherever you may be.
