Childish or Child-like?

The Gospel for Easter this year reminds me of little children. Mary of Magdala runs from the tomb when she sees it has been opened. Then Peter and the other disciple race each other to the tomb. The other one wins the race but Peter goes in first (John 20:1-5). Besides running like excited kids, there is another way they are like children.

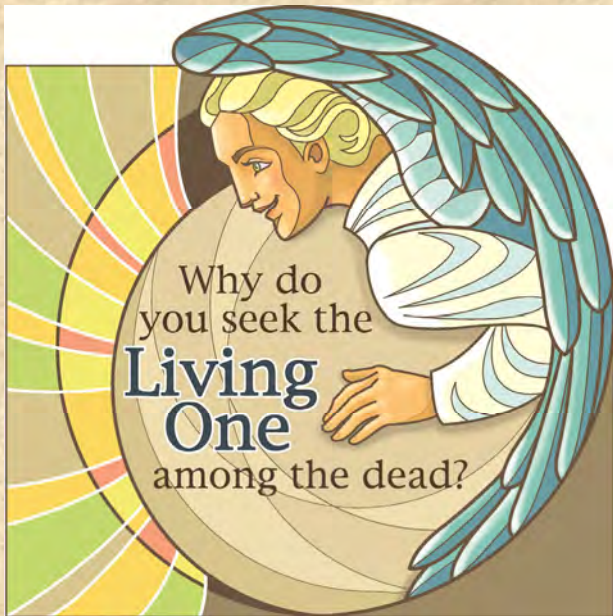
Remember the Gospel about St. Thomas, who would not believe Jesus' resurrection until he could see him? Compare that to the disciple in today's reading, who "saw [the empty tomb] and believed" (John 20:9). That is the kind of faith we find in a little child.

Children will believe in things they cannot see, especially if there is a good reason. We "bribe" them into believing in Santa Claus or the tooth fairy by giving them Christmas presents or money under the pillow. If we teach them that God made them and loves

them, if we love them ourselves and teach them to love others, they will have good reasons to believe in a real and loving God. As they get older, we can teach them how to pray, save money for the poor, visit the sick, or volunteer to help the homeless.

Jesus didn't say that only children could enter the Kingdom. He said we must become like children if we want to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3). Becoming like children does not mean being selfish or stubborn, throwing tantrums when we don't get our way. Those are childish behaviors that we put aside. Instead, we can keep a child-like faith and trust in God. Teaching them about God is a great way to help our own faith to grow. By giving them real examples of God's love for them, they will continue to believe long after they have given up the fairy tales of childhood.

THE LORD IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED! Today's readings remind us that this ancient greeting of the Apostles and early Christians is about more than looking back. They also anticipate the time when our lives will be united with Christ in glory.

In our First Reading, Peter gives a speech at the home of Cornelius, a Roman centurion who had been prompted in a vision to call Peter to his household. When Peter arrives, he testifies about Jesus' deeds and about how he died and was raised by God. The phrase "hanging him on a tree" refers to the Crucifixion, and likely reminds its readers of Deuteronomy 21:22, which says the crucified one is cursed by God. Yet this is not the end. Peter declares, "Everyone who believes in him will receive forgiveness of sins in his name."

The Gospel's telling of Mary Magdalene coming upon the empty tomb is interrupted by the story of Peter and the Beloved Disciple arriving at the tomb. The men enter and see the burial cloths and go home. The verses after the conclusion of today's Gospel show that only Mary remains at the tomb. Twice she hears, "Woman, why are you weeping?" Twice she cries that she cannot find Jesus' body, but the Risen Lord calls her by name and she recognizes him. He commissions her to go to the disciples as an apostle of the Resurrection.

Some questions for reflection:

- What did it mean to Peter to be a witness of the Resurrection? What does it mean to you?
- Imagine yourself as Mary searching for the Lord. What do you do?
- Create a stanza to the Responsorial Psalm that tells what the Lord's Resurrection means to you.

On behalf of Deacon Ricard, myself and our Parish Staff, we wish you a Blessed Easter Day and Season. It is with much joy that we celebrate these upcoming 50 days of Easter. We do so fully aware of Jesus' sacrifice for us. In the same way, we can celebrate that our acts of Lenten discipline have given us new strength, new hope and new life in the Risen Lord.

I am truly blessed to have witnessed such dedication to our Faith and to our God as we made our Lenten journey through the passion, death and resurrection. Your many sacrifices for ministry, for the feeding of the hungry, for prayer and for building up the family of God here in Plaquemine has been an inspiration for many if not all. In one of the prefaces of the Eucharistic Prayer it says that our sacrifices and disciplines are a part of our thanksgiving to God and that we recognize that the greatest effect of all we have done is that they "help us imitate God's kindness."

There are so many folks who contribute to keeping our Lent prayerful and focused on the Lord Jesus. Nursing home visits, visits to home bound or those on hospice, visits to prisoners, prayer blankets for the sick, catechists, Fishes & Loaves, bereavement, liturgical ministers (sacristans, altar servers, lectors, lay extraordinary ministers of the Eucharist, ushers, choir, organists, cantors, devotional leaders, children's church, marriage preparation sponsors, decorating committee, etc.), and prayer line ministers. We cannot forget the work of the Knights of Columbus, Knights of Peter Claver Women's Auxiliary, Catholic Daughters, Altar Society, Alhambra and St. Joseph Altar committee. Of course the largest ministry of St. John School. They too extend the mercy of Jesus beyond the school yard.

If I left anyone out, I am truly sorry. My point is to let you know that we are a family. We all contribute to the building up of the Kingdom of God. I rejoice at Easter because of the Risen Christ and because of your many expressions of faith that are beautiful in God's eyes and in mine as well. Thank you all.
