License to Sin

In the James Bond movies, 007 has a license to kill. He can shoot all the bad guys he wants without worrying about being charged with murder. God, however, does not issue a license to sin. The first reading from Sirach reminds us that any time we choose between life and death, good and evil, it is our free choice and our responsibility. God may allow us to make bad choices, but God never commands anyone to sin.

Jesus goes even deeper than Sirach. The people of Sirach's time had followed the laws and commandments that governed external actions. But Jesus taught that thoughts and desires that lead to sin can also be freely chosen or rejected. In the Gospel he gives us some examples.

The first is about killing. Jesus says that anyone who gets angry enough to kill or who looks down on his neighbor as not

deserving to live has committed murder in his heart. Because the Eucharist is our sacrament of unity, we should take care to be reconciled with others before coming to the altar.

The next warnings are about adultery and divorce, breaches that also begin with interior feelings. Jesus exaggerates when he tells us to cut off a hand or tear out an eye, because he knew how easily we rationalize our feelings and pretend they are harmless. Jesus takes marriage seriously and expects his disciples to do the same. His final example concerns taking oaths. Jesus gets to the point and says that we wouldn't need oaths if we always told the truth and kept our promises. Our faith is based on the knowledge that God keeps promises. Shouldn't we do the same?

Dear Family:

The reading from the Book of Sirach sets the scene for all of today's readings. Sirach offers practical wisdom on how to live according to God's instructions. The writer reminds us that God has gifted us with the power to choose freely: "Before man are life and death, good and evil, whichever he chooses shall be given him."

Paul's letter to the Corinthians shows what the call to choose life means. Embrace God's love by living according to God's wisdom, a plan hidden until now, a plan of love for the salvation of all humanity. Jesus Christ, the crucified "Lord of Glory," accomplished the Father's plan through his death and resurrection.

In the Gospel passage, Jesus continues the Sermon on the Mount as he illustrates how his message "fulfills the law and the prophets." He selects several commandments to point to the heart of his new way of life: "You have heard how it was said, You shall not kill...But I say to you, whoever is angry with his brother will be liable to judgment." Jesus shows that murder stems from within the human heart. The out-of-control emotion of anger within us, if left unchecked, leads to murder. To choose life in Christ means to pay attention not only to one's actions but, more importantly, to their roots within our inner being, to the emotions within us. Life in Christ implies that our whole being needs transformation, starting within the depths of our hearts.

Some questions for reflection:

How does Jesus advise us to avoid murder, adultery, and making false statements?

What is Jesus' concern when he says, "Do not swear at all"?

How do you try to live according to the challenge to choose life?

Saint Martin de Porres

During the month of February as we honor the history of African Americans in our country, let us not forget about the many saints of color who have carried forward the prophetic and compassionate work of Jesus in the history of our church.

St. Martin de Porres was born in Lima, Peru in 1579. He was born to a Spanish Knight and a freed woman of color from Panama. Martin had the dark features of his mother. His father eventually acknowledged Martin and his sisters as his children but left them to the care of their mother. At age 12 his mother apprenticed him to a Barber-Surgeon. At 15 he entered the third order of St. Dominic. Having become one of the Dominican Brothers he extended his care of the sick to those of the city, and was instrumental in establishing an orphanage, and foundling-hospital, with other charitable institutions attached; he was given the office of distributing the convent's daily alms of food to the poor (which he is said sometimes to have increased miraculously); and he took upon himself to care for the slaves who were brought to Peru from Africa. St. Martin was a close friend of St. Rose of Lima. St. Martin and St. Rose's remains lie in the Cathedral at Lima, Peru. Martin is the patron of social justice. At his canonization, the Pope said that due to Martin's love for the poor it is most appropriate that he be called Martin de Porres (Martin of the Poor).

Divine Mercy Novena Mass and Chaplet

This year on Tuesday, February 18 at 6pm our parish will begin its nine-week Novena of Divine Mercy with Mass, followed immediately by the sung chaplet of Divine Mercy, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Novena prayers.

Divine Mercy is a prominent theme of the Scriptures, in both the New Testament and the Old. In our own time, devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ has spread throughout the world in an extraordinary way through the grace of a private revelation given to a humble Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-38). Our Lord Himself appeared to St. Faustina and instructed her to act as His “Apostle of Divine Mercy,” giving her the following commission: *My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy!* He also instructed her to have an image of His Divine Mercy painted, just as He had appeared to her, so that veneration of this image would lead a great number of souls to Him. At the foundation of that image is the simple message, Jesus, I trust in You. Our Lord likewise instructed Faustina to let it be known that He wished the Sunday after Easter to be instituted in the Church as a universal Feast of Divine Mercy. Concerning the feast, Jesus made the following promise: *On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion on this day shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment.* This incomparable grace has been described as a kind of “second baptism,” including the remission of all sin and temporal punishment due to sin. (N.B. confession within a proximate time before the feast, e.g., during the season of Lent, is sufficient. One must receive the Eucharist worthily on the feast, this is, in the state of sanctifying grace.)

Jesus invites you to enter into the cloister of His Heart! This is the Message of Divine Mercy. He wants you to reside within His Heart and experience His Peace. Through His mediation, He wants you to come to know God the Father and the Holy Spirit, too. There is nothing that Our Lord withholds from the soul who sincerely seeks Him with humble repentance, generosity and trust. Jesus Christ loves you with all His Heart, and He wants to dwell within your heart, too. If there is a need for healing there (and indeed, there is always need for healing there), you can be sure that He knows just what to do.

You are invited to come on the nine Tuesdays from February 18 through April 14, 2020, in preparation for the Feast of Divine Mercy (the second Sunday of Easter) on April 19.
