Fifth Sunday of Lent

April 3, 2022
God's Justice



The story of Jesus and the woman caught in adultery is sometimes considered as a put-down of the scribes and Pharisees. They were hoping to get Jesus to cause a scandal by refuting the law, or, if he upheld the law, the woman would be killed with Jesus' approval. Jesus had a better idea. He shows that God's justice is mercy and forgiveness. He also knew that someone whose sins were forgiven would be willing to forgive the woman.

That's what St. Paul means in the second reading. He says he has given up the idea of making himself righteous (right with God) by keeping the laws of his people. Now he depends on his faith in Christ and Christ's forgiveness, which was shown in his death and resurrection. Why did Paul come to this

kind of faith? Because he had been forgiven for persecuting Christians. He had persecuted them, not because he was evil, but because he thought he was keeping the law.

So is keeping the law a bad thing? No, but the important thing is why we keep the law. We can do it like the Pharisees--keeping the law as a status symbol: "I'm too good (or too important) to break the law." Or we can choose to follow Jesus' way of love. Then we still keep the laws and commandments, only because they are examples of how to love God and love each other.

Thanks as well to all of our church organizations who helped cook, make cookies, set up tents and chairs. Thanks as well to my brother Knights who provide the use of the Hall for our great gatherings.

Thanks also to Mr. Chris Reeves and his team for putting on a great auction for our St. John School. It was great to see so many folks out supporting our school with Eagle Pride. Thanks to all who helped and participated.

Lent at St. John the Evangelist has provided many opportunities for praise, worship, prayer and apostolic work. Thanks to all who are making this first Lent outside of the pandemic a holy season of journeying with Jesus to the cross and resurrection.

Thanks as well to Mrs. Wanda Ashley who leads our young people in preparing for the Sacraments. Baptisms, Confirmation and our recent celebration of First Eucharist were lifegiving parish events. Wanda and her team, Mrs. Susan from St. John School and parents all helped make First Eucharist a blessing for all.

Our Finance Committee met recently to discuss our finances. We continue to be blessed by your kindness and generosity in these difficult times. Due to the pandemic our collections are down, but have recently seen that giving has increased some. Still, there is more to do. At the meeting, a motion was made and accepted that we would begin the process of building a new storage building behind the church where the current mini-storage unit lies. This will be used primarily for items for the Nativity Scene and other seasonal decorations for our large church. These are currently stored on the second floor of the office building. However, we are concerned about the great difficulty in moving such expensive pieces via the stairwell as many pieces cannot be moved by using the elevator. We will be going to the Diocese for approval. The Finance Committee, noting that we currently have no debt with the diocese, decided unanimously to request a loan for half of the amount that will be needed for the project. As soon as the drawings are done we will meet with the Diocesan Building Board for approval.

Our Insurance carrier, Catholic Mutual, has taken over the litigation over the St. Clement Chapel restoration. I pray they will bring quick results. Again, we will keep you informed.

We are publishing with this bulletin our annual Financial Report. Please know we are grateful for your support and look to continue our good stewardship of your treasures.

Finally, I've recently heard of some gossiping that is hurtful. Let us please ask the Lord to help watch over our tongues. Please remember that our words can sometimes hurt others be it personal or professional. Lord, please help us!

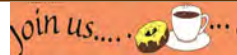

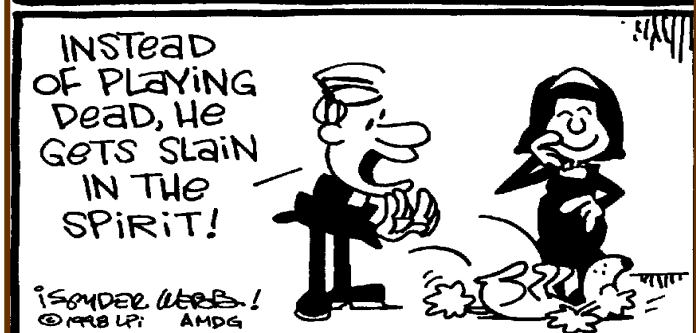
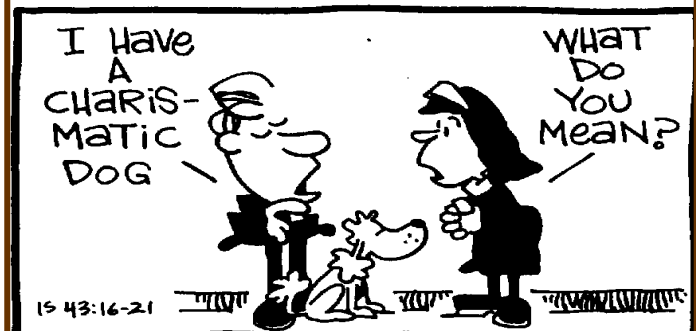
The Altar Society will be selling Little Easter Books (\$1) before and after all Masses Saturday and Sunday, April 9 and 10 outside the doors of the church.
