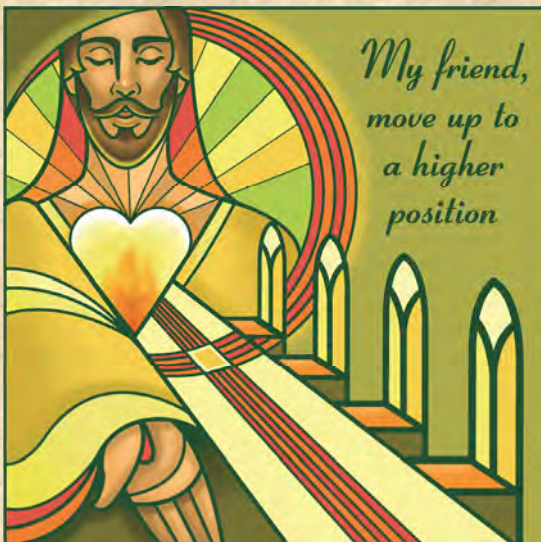

Partying with Angels

While the first reading from Sirach and the Gospel focus on humility, with a surprise reversal of the humble being exalted, the reading from Hebrews surprises us in a different way. The author uses apocalyptic imagery to show how much the relationship between God and humanity has changed. He starts with images of fire, storms, and trumpet blasts--images that may remind you of an erupting volcano. Even God's words brought fear and trembling.

It may not be surprising that God is beyond human comprehension, but Hebrews says no. God doesn't want to be so far beyond us that we only approach in fear. Using more images from the end-time, the author gives us a picture of the baptized partying with angels and all the just who have died. And of course God is the host. Let's look at some of those images to see how our relationship with the Lord has grown.

The heavenly Jerusalem reminds us that the Church is our home--not just your parish church building but the whole community of faith. How "at home" are you with your fellow parishioners? A church community can be a place to support those who are sick or jobless or depressed. It is also a place to be supported, to see God's love in action. The angels in Hebrews may be a symbol of that support.

The "firstborn" and "spirits of the just" could remind us of those who went before us and now rest in the Lord. They had their own struggles in life, and now live in glory. They help us to keep our true goal in mind, eternal life.

Jesus came to show us how much God loves us and how close God can be. When he shed his blood on the cross (the final sign in our reading), he renewed the covenant with God's people. We accept that gift not just by a verbal statement of faith, but by a life lived as Jesus showed us, in love of God and our neighbor.

Dear Family:

Today's reading from Sirach offers us teachings from the Wisdom tradition. The biblical texts identified as "Wisdom" tend to focus on how to live well. Much of this material offers instruction. This passage is taken out of a larger portion that focuses on the importance of the virtue of humility, a virtue of no less value today than it was at the time this text was composed.

Our reading from Hebrews refers to two mountain scenes or experiences. The first reference is to Mount Sinai, the holy mountain where God was made manifest and entered into a covenant relationship with Israel; the second reference is to Mount Zion and the temple. This latter scene, however, should not be understood as the earthly Jerusalem but as the heavenly Jerusalem, where continental promises will be fulfilled.

Luke's Gospel for today offers much for reflection. While Jesus accepted an invitation "to dine at the home of one of the leading Pharisees," we should not miss the rest of this verse that states, "and the people there were observing him." The verb used here can imply that the Pharisees were waiting for Jesus to do something in which they could find fault. What will Jesus do? What will he say? Jesus tells a parable. This parable is about a banquet and where people position themselves. Do they select a place of honor? Or do they humbly take a place further from the host, grateful for having been invited to this meal? Jesus then addresses the Pharisee, the host of the dinner. These words also are addressed to us. They confront us with the lavish love of our God. All are welcome at God's banquet.

Some questions for reflection:

- How do you understand the virtue of humility?
- Reread what Jesus says to the host of the wedding banquet. Do you believe that God invites everyone to the kingdom?
- How does today's Gospel challenge you to see all people as children of God?

Bishop Michael Duca Celebrates Mass at "The Smallest Church in the World"



Bishop Michael Duca, assisted by Father Jason Palermo, celebrated Mass at the Madonna Chapel in Bayou Goula on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

The chapel, known to many as "The Smallest Church in the World" was built in 1903 by Tony Gullo in thanksgiving to the Blessed Mother for his child's recovery from a serious illness. Constructed of Louisiana cypress, the church measures 9' x 9' and will only accommodate a few people at a time.

Shortly after completion in 1903, a Mass of thanksgiving was celebrated on the Feast of the Assumption of Mary and became a tradition which continues today. Every year worshippers assemble on the front lawn of the chapel for the special annual Mass.

The large Madonna statue in the chapel was ordered from Italy by Mr. Gullo and predates the chapel. Each year, the statue is adorned with jewelry that over the years has been offered in thanksgiving. Through the years, donations and fundraisers have provided the necessary funds for upkeep.

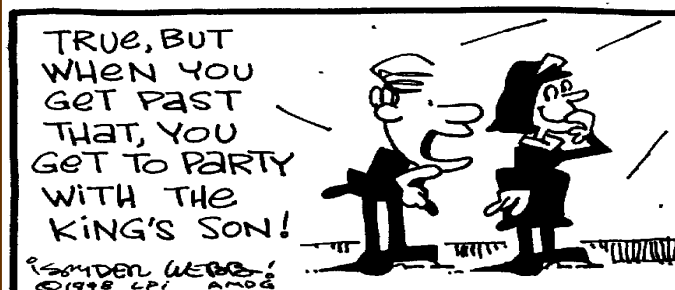
