"O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Matthew 14:31

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time August 13, 2023 Why did you doubt? (Matthew 14:31)

Isn't it interesting how doubts often pop into our heads unbidden and unwanted? Peter was actually walking on water, just like Jesus. But when he took his focus off the Lord and noticed the strong wind, doubt entered his mind: Can I really do this? That's when he started to sink (Matthew 14:30).

"Why did you doubt?" the Lord asks Peter after rescuing him (Matthew 14:31). That's a question we might ask ourselves at times. After all, we know how doubts can paralyze us, confuse us, or even lead us away from the Lord.

And yet we are all prone to doubt. When we are suffering, we might wonder whether God loves us. If we've committed a serious sin, we might question whether God will forgive us. When we get discouraged by the evil in the world, we might doubt that God is really in control.

Doubts are a natural human response to uncertainty, so we shouldn't berate ourselves for having them. Sometimes they don't even come from us; the evil one loves to plant doubts in our minds in order to shake up our faith. Whatever the case, they don't disqualify us from following Jesus. Just look at the apostle Thomas! Even a great saint like Thérèse of Lisieux struggled with doubts as she lay dying.

The key is to deal with our doubts not by focusing on them but by calling out to the Lord as Peter did: "Lord, save me!" (Matthew 14:30). And just as he did for Peter, Jesus will stretch out his hand to us. He will remind us of who he is: a loving, compassionate, merciful, and mighty God. He will help us recall all he has done for us. He will assure us that he will never leave us and that nothing will ever separate us from his love.

You don't have to try to battle your doubts on your own. Jesus has come to save you—even from your doubts!

Dear Family,

God does not always appear how and where we expect, and Christ often calls us to follow him in ways that we cannot fathom.

In the first reading, Elijah encounters God in an unusual site and manner. Although he is at the place where Moses met God centuries before, this was unfamiliar territory for Elijah, whose home was distant from Horeb. Elijah had previously encountered God in places of worship and sacrifice, like his own offering on Mount Carmel. God had now called him to a distant land to show him something new.

Elijah realizes God is present when he hears the "tiny whispering sound." No one knows what phenomenon these words describe. Some suggest it was intuition. Others propose that it was an unnatural stillness in the environment. The other phenomena mentioned - wind, earthquake, and flame - all manifested God' presence in older Israelite traditions. Indeed, at Mount Carmel, God had appeared in a fire that fell from the sky. But in this "tiny whispering sound," Elijah encountered God in an unfamiliar way and place.

In the Gospel passage, the wonder is not just that Jesus is somewhere he cannot possibly be and doing something he cannot possibly do. It is also that he calls Peter to join him. Matthew emphasizes this call in his version of this event. Peter can walk on water because he saw Jesus doing it first. Unlike Elijah, however, whose constant faith let God show him something new, Peter's fear subverted the evidence of his eyes.

To follow Christ without fear, we must seek him out in unfamiliar places, listening for his quiet but unmistakable Word. Once we find him, we need to follow him past any fears. Then we too will have the faith to walk on water, side by side with the Son of God.

Some thoughts for reflection:

Contrast Elijah's and Peter's responses to the Lord's call. When have you found grace in unusual ways or places? How has Christ called you to follow without fear?

A huge welcome to all returning from their summer recreation as we begin a new school year. We offer prayers and blessings for all teachers and students in our St. John School and in our Government Schools. May God bless us all with a wonderful year of learning.

I hope our eyes are opened to the many miracles that are happening around us. There is so much discord surrounding us and we can sometimes be caught up in worldly despair. As a Christian, we can counter the distress by using our spiritual eyesight to find the many miracles around us. For example, there are several folks who have received the Sacrament of Anointing over these summer months and have been granted what seems to be miraculous healings. Please remember that we celebrate the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick on the first Tuesday of the month at our evening Mass.

Many thanks to God and to all of your prayers that have helped our parishioner Greg Navarre who has been granted healing through an organ transplant. It has been a long road for Greg and his family. Thanks also to all those who helped with the fundraiser for Greg this weekend.




