Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Not My Problem

Ever notice how people today like to ignore the evil in the world? People will witness a mugging and not bother to call the police. We see television stories of children starving in poor countries and say, "Not my problem." The readings for this Sunday challenge this attitude.

In the Gospel, Jesus' words teach us something about our duty to the sinner. First, he tells us that sin is our problem, and when we see it we need to take the initiative to stop it. Second, he tells us we need not feel alone in this duty. When the sinner refuses to listen, we bring in help. In fact, this command is meant for the whole church. Third, he tells us to be persistent; don't give up on someone too easily.

Someone too easily.
So what about that line about treating the sinner who refuses to listen as a Gentile or tax collector? On the one hand, the sinner would be excluded from the church, excommunicated, if he doesn't repent. On the other hand, Jesus never rejected tax collectors (like Matthew himself, who wrote this Gospel) or Gentiles. He said he came to call sinners, to save them. He loves sinners. And that is the reason we are to confront them—not to punish them, but to love them. For God never forces a person to repent. God invites with love, especially the love Jesus showed by dying on the cross. May we all learn to fight evil with love! Tom Schmidt

Pastor's Letter

Dear Family:

I had a friend who had a terrible drug problem, and I feared for his life. When I tried to talk to him about it, he believed I was being



manipulative. I had failed to communicate my compassion, and only spoke of my frustration and fear. As a result, he felt justified to ignore my intervention.

Because it is easy to fall into this trap, many people are hesitant to challenge another even when there is good reason to do so. Jesus expects this of his followers, however. Jesus was effective because he wanted nothing from the people he encountered. His compassion and generosity were obvious to the most hardened sinners. He knew how to find their hidden dignity and how to speak to it with respect and hope. Their hardened hearts beat anew in his compassionate presence.

We are responsible for each other, as this Sunday's first reading shows. "If...you do not speak out to dissuade the wicked from his way," the prophet Ezekiel learned, "the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will held you responsible for his but I will hold you responsible for his death." Correcting each other is nonnegotiable.

Jesus teaches us how to correct another properly. The command to "treat him as you would a Gentile or tax collector" is not harsh when one remembers that Jesus tirelessly proclaimed divine love to exactly such individuals. As Christians, we too recognize the love God has for everyone. Just as that love motivated Jesus to find the greatest. as that love motivated Jesus to find the greatest sinners and treat them with compassion, so we too must address each other out of the love God has taught us.

Some thoughts/questions for reflection: Today is World Suicide Prevention Day; ask a friend to join you in praying for those who may be cut off from hope or help by despair. Has anyone ever corrected you with compassion? How did you

To whom can you offer loving correction? Jesus follows his teaching on correction with teachings about forgiveness and prayer. In putting these teachings together, what deeper realities does Jesus reveal?




