Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time The Cross of Forgiveness

Why should we forgive those who hurt us? The gospel this Sunday gives three reasons: First, because Jesus commands it. Second, because forgiveness is part of loving one another. And third, because we want to be forgiven for our sins.
Here Jesus commands us to forgive unceasingly, without limit.
Now that could be a challenge for even the most patient person. Does it mean we have to let someone hurt us over and over? No, it is possible to forgive someone and also prevent them

love (the second reason.) For instance, we might forgive an alcoholic family member, but still insist that they get help. Since forgiveness is part of love, it is also part of tough love.

That leads to the third reason: We forgive because we have been forgiven. Jesus has already died for our sins. If we truly believe that Jesus is risen and that we will rise to eternal life with him in spite of our sins, how can we refuse to forgive someone who hurts us?

Dear Family:

God forgives, and so must we. This is the message of this Sundaẏ́'s readings. Sometimes forgiveness is easy. Frienďs and family know how to brush off each other's small transgressions



as the Book of Proverbs states, "Love covers all offenses" [10:12], an insight that was repeated in the New Testament. [1 Corinthians 13:7; James 5:20; 1Peter 4:8].

Sometimes forgiveness is difficult. Some sick people enjoy hurting others. Many more sin against each other out of ego or fear, inflicting thoughtless damage out of insecurity. Still others live with destructive tendencies such as addictions, mental illness, or trauma. Although these are out of their control, such inclinations make relationships difficult. Finding ways to forgive in circumstances like these can feel like a hopeless task.

Jesus did not agree. "Not seven times, but seventyseven times," said Jesus, responding to Peter's question with an absurdly large number. The Old Testament already had a long tradition of teaching forgiveness. God forgate the sevenant and desired the seven times, but seven times times times to be seven times. its transgressions against the covenant, and prophets and teachers reminded individual Israelites to do the same. As this Sunday's first reading proclaims, God's tireless compassion should be the pattern for ours.

"Moved with compassion, the master of that servant let him go and forgave him the loan." In this parable, forgiveness means starting over from zero. Whatever happened in the past is gone, and a new relationship takes place. God finds new reasons for compassion every time we request forgiveness. This is the example of freedom Christ calls us to follow. Forgiveness costs God nothing but instead deepens opportunities for divine love. Just so, Christ calls his followers to the same freedom. No one can take anything from us that God cannot replace tenfold. This realization can inspire our sense of compassion and free us to forgive, no matter the amount of mercy required.

Some questions for reflection:

What have you learned from being forgiven? How can Christ teach you to forgive? What does the king know that makes him so free to forgive his debtors? How can a similar knowledge guide our acts of forgiveness?
