

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 4, 2024 What do You Want?

Jesus was starting to become very popular, at least with the ordinary people. They had seen how he had cured the sick and cast out demons. Jesus knew the people would not understand this and try to proclaim him as their king. Jesus had no intention of living as a worldly king, in comfort and riches. In fact, he came to free people from needing wealth and power.

Popularity and wealth do not interest St. Paul, either. When he preaches the gospel, the good news of Christ's resurrection, He specifically refuses to be paid for his preaching, to show that he will be rewarded by Christ.

So what do you hope for; what is your goal in life? Do you only feel secure when you have saved enough money and invested it wisely? Do you need other people to make you happy? Or at least a few hundred Facebook friends?

We can follow Paul's example of love for all people no matter who they are. Paul's love was not to make others like him. He genuinely wanted to bring the good news to them: by his love for them, Paul showed that God loves them even more. Let us ask the Lord to fill us with his love, so that we can help each other to hear the good news. Tom Schmidt

Dear Family,

Today's Gospel passage illustrates another Markan passage where Jesus is setting a person free from bondage. After having freed a man from an unclean spirit (1:21:28), Jesus restores a woman (Simon's mother-in-law) from the torment and paralysis of fever to health. As the psalmist declares, God's greatness is in God's goodness and

graciousness, particularly to those who are wounded and in need (Psalm 147:1-6)

Just as the healing performed by Mark's Jesus seems to be instantaneous, the service of Peter's mother-inlaw also seems to be immediate. As soon as she has experienced the healing touch of Jesus, she goes to work. Note that her service here is extended to everyone present and not limited to Jesus, who has cured her.

Similarly, we see Jesus healing all kinds of people with various problems (1:32-34). One of the signs of the coming of God's reign is the release of humans from the bondage of sickness and possession by demons, or what today we may call bondage of the body and of the mind.

Mark's Gospel makes a point of showing that Jesus is not concerned with bringing attention to himself. As he did with the unclean spirit, Jesus would not allow the demons who knew him to reveal his identity or talk about him (1:34). Instead of basking in the praise and thanks of those whom he has cured, he withdraws to a "deserted place" and then departs from Galilee, even though he has gained the attention of all the people there (Mark 1:21, 35-39). We see a similar message by Paul in today's reading from 1 Corinthians 9. Rather than boasting and seeking attention for himself, Paul emphasizes service to others. We also see this in the example of Peter's mother-in-law.

Some questions for reflection:

What kinds of things keep humanity in bondage today?

What makes service or ministry to others difficult or challenging?

What kinds of service or ministry can you extend to other people today?

Brothers and Sisters, all priests will be on retreat this coming week. Please keep us and our Bishop in prayer as we take this time away to be with the Lord Jesus.


CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL OUR YOUNG PEOPLE WHO RECEIVED THE SACRAMENT OF CONFIRMATION.

To the Lay Faithful of the Diocese of Baton Rouge:

The annual retreat for priests of the Diocese of Baton Rouge will be 05-08 February 2024 at Manresa House of Retreats in Covent. These days of prayer and contemplation represent an important occasion for their renewal and growth in spiritual formation and well-being. As such, participation by our active priests is mandatory.

Thus, their temporary absence during this period of retreat will affect certain regular pastoral ministries. If the local parish staff is unable to secure a deacon for funeral needs, the parish staff may call the Office of the Vicar General by dialing 225.387.0561 for further assistance.

Thank you for understanding and supporting our priests with their ongoing formation and renewal for ministry! Please pray for our priests and our diocese during these days. I appreciate your affirmation and encouragement of our priests who give their lives for our diocese. May God be generous in leading us into a future filled with hope.

Divine Mercy Novena Mass and Chaplet

This year on <u>Tuesday, February 6</u> at 6pm our parish will begin its nine-week Novena of Divine Mercy with Mass, followed immediately by the sung chaplet of Divine Mercy and Novena prayers.

Divine Mercy is a prominent theme of the Scriptures, in both the New Testament and the Old. In our own time, devotion to the Divine Mercy of Jesus Christ has spread throughout the world in an extraordinary way through the grace of a private revelation given to a humble Polish nun, St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-38). Our Lord Himself appeared to St. Faustina and instructed her to act as His "Apostle of Divine Mercy," giving her the following commission: *My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy!* He also instructed her to have an image of His Divine Mercy painted, just as He had appeared to her, so that veneration of this image would lead a great number of souls to Him. At the foundation of that image is the simple message, Jesus, I trust in You. Our Lord likewise instructed Faustina to let it be known that He wished the Sunday after Easter to be instituted in the Church as a universal Feast of Divine Mercy. Concerning

the feast, Jesus made the following promise: On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My Mercy. The souls that will go to confession and receive Holy Communion on this day shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. This incomparable grace has been described as a kind of "second baptism," including the remission of all sin and temporal punishment due to sin. (N.B. confession within a proximate time before the feast, e.g., during the season of Lent, is sufficient. One must receive the Eucharist worthily on the feast, this is, in the state of sanctifying grace.)

Jesus invites you to enter into the cloister of His Heart! This is the Message of Divine Mercy. He wants you to reside within His Heart and experience His Peace. Through His mediation, He wants you to come to know God the Father and the Holy Spirit, too. There is nothing that Our Lord withholds from the soul who sincerely seeks Him with humble repentance, generosity and trust. Jesus Christ loves you with all His Heart, and He wants to dwell within your heart, too. If there is a need for healing there (and indeed, there is always need for healing there), you can be sure that He knows just what to do.

You are invited to come on the nine Tuesdays from February 6 through April 2, 2024, in preparation for the Feast of Divine Mercy (the second Sunday of Easter) on April 7.

Lent

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, a day of fast and abstinence.

Ash Wednesday Schedule:

7am - Mass & Distribution of Ashes 12 Noon - Liturgy of the Word & Distribution of Ashes 6pm - Mass & Distribution of Ashes

Lenten Weekday Schedule:

Fasting & Abstinence

Fasting: On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those who are 18, but not yet 59, are allowed only one full meal. Two small meals are allowed as needed, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

Abstinence from Meat: Those who are 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent. The Church no longer attempts to prescribe our Lenten practices in detail. The above regulations simply highlight Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and other Fridays in Lent.

Historical Tidbit About Catholicism in Iberville Parish and St. John the **Evangelist Catholic Church**

When was Immaculate Conception Church decommissioned and parishioners asked to join either St. John the Evangelist Church or St. Clement of Rome Church?

Immaculate Conception Church was decommissioned in 1987 by the Diocese of Baton Rouge. It was a mission church established in the 1930's through the collaboration of Rev. Leonard Robin and Rev. Thomas McNamara, S.S.J.
Superior General. Josephite priests served
Immaculate Conception from 1960-1983. On
December 8, 2017, the bell that rang at Immaculate
Conception Church was commemorated by Rev. Gregory Daigle with a plaque and stand near the statue of Mary at St. John the Evangelist Church.
