

## Easter Sunday April 20, 2025 Childish of Child-like?

The Gospel for Easter this year reminds me of little children. Mary of Magdala runs from the tomb when she sees it has been opened. Then Peter and the other disciple race each other to the tomb. The other one wins the race but Peter goes in first (John 20:1–5). Besides running like excited kids, there is another way they are like children.

Remember the Gospel about St. Thomas, who would not believe Jesus' resurrection until he could see him? Compare that to the disciple in today's reading, who "saw [the empty tomb] and believed" (John 20:9). That is the kind of faith we find in a little child.

Children will believe in things they cannot see, especially if there is a good reason. We "bribe" them into believing in Santa Claus or the tooth fairy by giving them Christmas presents or money under the pillow. If we teach them that God made them and loves them, if we love them ourselves and teach them to love others, they will have good reasons to believe in a real and loving God. As they get older, we can teach them how to pray, save money for the poor, visit the sick, or volunteer to help the homeless.

Jesus didn't say that only children could enter the Kingdom. He said we must become like children if we want to enter the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 18:3). Becoming like children does not mean being selfish or stubborn, throwing tantrums when we don't get our way. Those are childish behaviors that we put aside. Instead, we can keep a child-like faith and trust in God. Teaching them about God is a great way to help our own faith to grow. By giving them real examples of God's love for them, they will continue to believe long after they have given up the fairy tales of childhood.



## Pastor's Letter

Easter 2025 Dear Family:

#### HAPPY EASTER. THE LORD IS RISEN INDEED!

Decon Ricard, myself, our parish and school staff extend our wishes for you and your families to enjoy a Blessed, Happy Easter. We have spent our Lent praying, doing penance, performing acts of mercy and more deeply following the Lord Jesus. May God, who raised Jesus from the dead, lift us all up in this new holy season of Easter.

New Testament writers speak of God as "able to accomplish far more than all we ask or imagine," as Paul says in one of his letters [Ephesians 3:20]. They derive this insight from the resurrection, which was an outcome vastly beyond what Christ's disciples expected. The readings this Sunday show New Testament writers coming to terms with God's ability to achieve from even the worst tragedy a glorious reversal.

This is obvious in the Gospel. The empty tomb is a source of confusion and anxiety for Mary Magdalene, Peter, and the beloved disciple. Mary and the beloved disciple do not even enter at first. Only Peter does, and what he finds there perplexes him utterly. But as the beloved disciple reflects, he finds reasons for hope. Anyone moving Jesus' body would have left it bound; it would have been much easier to transport fully wrapped. The discarded burial cloths signify that the one once bound by them was now free.

In today's second reading, Paul teaches that Jesus' resurrection gives us hope for a glorious end to our lives. Even as we live, death eats away at us through misfortunes such as illness, fear, injury, and persecution. Discipleship in Christ means that our life has somehow mystically merged with his. When we pray and perform acts of mercy, we rely on Christ's conquest of death to overcome our earthly misfortunes. When we die in faith, we rely on Christ to raise us as he himself rose. God can even subvert the universal dominion of death.

Although subtle, a reversal of sorts also appears in this Sunday's first reading. Peter, explaining the significance of Jeus' resurrection, describes the mission that Christ left the apostles. They are to preach forgiveness, even to the very people who killed him. No human mind could have conceived of such mercy. Only God, whose wisdom is beyond anything that can be asked or imagined, is capable of such love.

Some questions for reflection:

What evidence have you found that Christ is alive and at work? How do you rely on Christ to overcome misfortune? How can you strengthen your ability to forgive?

Many Thanks for all who assisted in making our Lent holy and our Easter Day joyful. Thanks to our liturgical ministers, Altar Society, Catholic Daughters, Knights of Columbus, St. John School and Parish catechists, Gary Perrault and his many helpers, our OCIA team and sponsors, and all of you in the pew and in the vineyard who have sacrificed this Lent for the good of God's people. Your witnessing of our faith in the Risen Lord has been a great blessing for our community. Please know of our gratitude for all you have done to make us one family in Christ.


